26) If you could ask the main character a question, what would you ask? What do you think the answer would be?

27) Think of 5 interesting words to describe the setting of the story.

28) Think of another title for this book. Explain why you have chosen this new title.

29) Think of 5 interesting words to describe the main character(s) in the story.

30) Re-read your favourite part of the story out loud and explain why you have chosen this part.

31) Create a new ending for a favourite story. How is it different to the ending in the book?

32) Think of a choice that one of the characters made in the book. Would you have made the same choice? Why or why not?
